Purpose:

To introduce the new Potenza family of performance tires, highlighting the new Bridgestone technology available in the S-02, RE930 and RE900.

Each days activities will begin with a classroom style technical highlights presentation. This will be done at the hotel.

The track event will be broken into three sections. Each section will highlight/feature one member of the S-02/RE930/RE900 family. They are:

- 1. Porsche On Track Fast Ride and Drive with professional drivers. S-02
- Autocross in paddock in Acuras RE930
- Wet Skid Pad, lower paddock. RE900 & S-02

There will be opportunities for all participants to ride in the Porsche SuperCup race car with a professional driver. A debriefing will be held at the track before returning to the hotel.

- 2. Peter Cunningham (Firehawk Champion, SCCA Champion)
- 3. David Murray (Firehawk Champion, SuperCar Driver)
- 4. Jeff Purner (IMSA, Firehawk, Trans Am Driver)
- 5. Rex McDaniel (Skip Barber Head Corporate Event Instructor)

Porsche has agreed to provide automobiles, (4) 1995 911 Carreras, for the track event. Acura has agreed to provide (4) Integra GSRs. Three will be used for the autocross event. We will use two Porsche 968s Coupe six speeds and one of the Integras on the wet skid pad.

PR will be responsible for inviting the media, providing for a hospitality team to meet and greet, track rental, insurance coverage, waivers, legal, vehicle transportation, photography, hotel and dinner functions for the media..

Marketing will be responsible for obtaining vehicles, drivers, tires, tire service, wearables, technical

presentations, dealer travel, video documentation and event support.

Sales will be responsible for any second day dealer functions beyond the hotel and track events, (golf. etc.).

This event will be a major undertaking and instrumental to the success of the new Potenza family. It requires an intensive work force from BFTS. All support personnel should plan on arriving in Atlanta and at the hotel no later than Sunday, March 26.

### March 31, Friday

Media departures, Clean up, Go Home, Fall Down

Track Event Details: All groups will consist of 18 participants. They will be divided into teams of six members. Three teams of six will attend each of the three sections or activities for approximately 90 minutes. Then they will rotate to the next event. Bridgestone personnel will accompany each team to the next event and keep track of time. Key Bridgestone personnel will be identified in each section to supervise that activity. Each team will remain at their designated event.

<u>Porsche S-02 Fast Ride and Drive</u>: The purpose of the exercise is to provide dealers and journalists with an exciting high speed experience on the new Potenza S-02. The fast ride will utilize three of the four available 1995 Porsche 911s (993). The fourth will be reserved for back-up or wet skid pad. Three cars are six speed coupes, one is a Carrera 4 (all wheel drive) and the back up car is a tiptronic cabriolet.

At the end of each morning's product presentation, there will be a short (10 minutes) driving education session regarding oversteer, understeer, turn-in point, apex, track-out point etc. given by one of the professional drivers (Peter, or David?)

On the dealer day (Tuesday), one of the professional drivers will give a short (5 minutes) talk on safety and proper technique. Then the dealers will be driven on two slow reconnaissance laps by the professional drivers to familiarize them with the track. Upon return to the pit area, the professional drivers will swap into the passenger seat and allow the dealer to drive a total of four laps at whatever speed they and the professional are both comfortable. The first lap will start in the pit lane, the second lap will be a flyer all the way around the track and the third will end in the pit lane. The three cars will be staggered so as to eliminate any potential contact.

This exercise will be repeated for the second group of three dealers. Upon completion of all dealer laps, the professionals will return to the drivers seat and give each dealer four laps at speed to demonstrate the maximum handling potential of the S-02. At the same time, the four professional driver will give fast rides in the Bridgestone/Porsche SuperCup race car. These rides will last a total of three laps per rider. The entire sequence of events will be repeated three times per day.

Ultimately during the dealer day, each set of tires will have to last the following number of laps.

Road Atlanta is a fairly non-abrasive surface. The left side tires take the bulk of abuse. Since all sessions start and finish in the pit lane, only one-third of the total number of laps will be at full speed by either the professional or dealer. One set of tires per car, per day should be satisfactory.

One media days (Wednesday and Thursday), the event will be similar with one exception, some of the journalists are experienced professional drivers. These drivers will be spread out over the two days and scheduled to be the last group

of the day on the track. This will minimize any potential problems, mechanical or otherwise, until everyone else is finished driving. The first two groups will be identical to the above sequence of events. The third "Pro" group will be allowed to drive a total of eight laps at speed in lieu of the four and three format.

After all the "Pro" media have driven in the normal 911 Carreras, they will each be given three demonstration laps in the SuperCup 911 by a professional.

In my past experience on Road Atlanta, one set of shaved RE71s lasted for two complete days on a 911 when driven four to five twenty minute sessions (12 laps) per day. One set per day plus two complete back up sets for all cars (including the back up car) will be more than sufficient.

Acura Autocross Event: The autocross will set up in the upper paddock area. It will be a simple, low speed course designed to test the RE930's steering response and handling ability. The purpose of the exercise is to demonstrate the performance advantage of the Potenza RE930 and the Turanza H. It will also help demonstrate the difference between touring and performance tires. Two Acura Integra GSRs will be fitted with RE930s and two will be fitted with Turanza Hs in the same 195/60HR15 size. Each driver will drive on the RE930s and on Turanzas for five laps each. A Bridgestone representative will ride in the cars at all times to reinforce what the drivers are actually experiencing while driving on the two types of tires. After everyone has made their ten laps, two teams of three will be assigned to one of the two RE930 Acuras and they will them compete for fastest elapsed times for two laps per driver. Each driver will complete two laps and then after coming to a complete stop, the next driver will get in, put on the seatbelt and do their two laps. The third driver will do the same, but time will stop when they cross the finish line. Just like in Solo II, pylons knocked down and out of the marked box will add two seconds apiece to cumulative time. Each team's times for that day will be posted on a chalkboard for everyone else to see. Each member of the fastest team overall each day will win a free set of Potenza RE930s.

<u>Wet Skid Pad Event</u>: The lower skid pad will be utilized as a wet skid pad. The purpose of the exercise is two fold. First we will demonstrate the advanced water evacuation characteristics of the Potenza S-02 over the Potenza RE71 and secondly, we will demonstrate the superb wet traction characteristics of the Potenza RE900. This will require three cars. Two identical 16" tire equipped vehicles for S-02 and RE71 and one of the Acura Integras for RE900. I will try and obtain two Porsche 968s for this event.

In the first demonstration participants will observe the visual differences in water evacuation between RE71 and the S-02 as well as the RE900. Drivers will make 10 laps in each car to demonstrate. After observing, the participants will then ride with the drivers for 10 laps to see and feel the difference inside the cars. After riding, participants will swap into the drivers seat and drive each car for five laps around the skid pad themselves. This exercise will repeat until all participants have ridden and driven all three cars.
